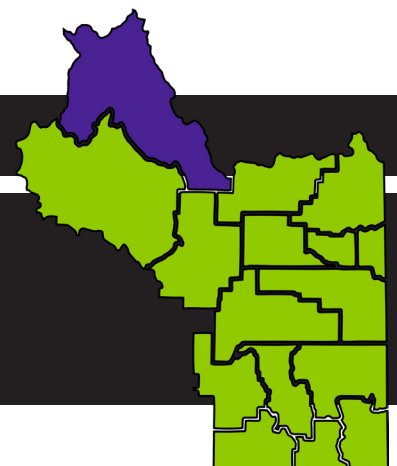

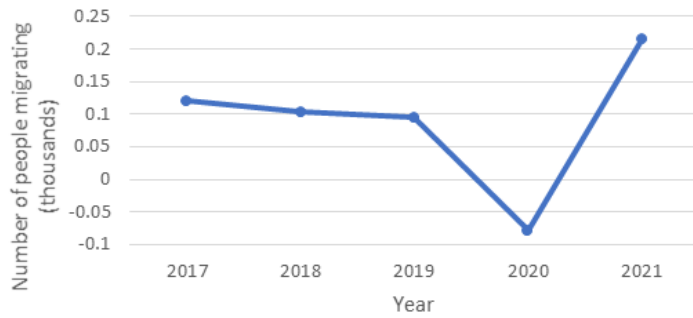
Lemhi County's population has increased on average 0.14% year-over-year in the last decade. It has had positive growth since 2020, and peaked in 2021, at 2.69%.

NET MIGRATION FLOW

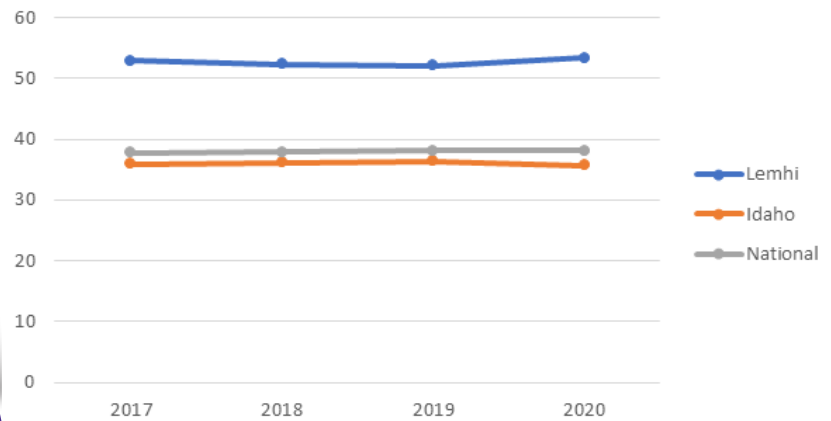
In 2021, over 200 people moved to Lemhi County. Since 2017, the average number of new residents was 90 per year

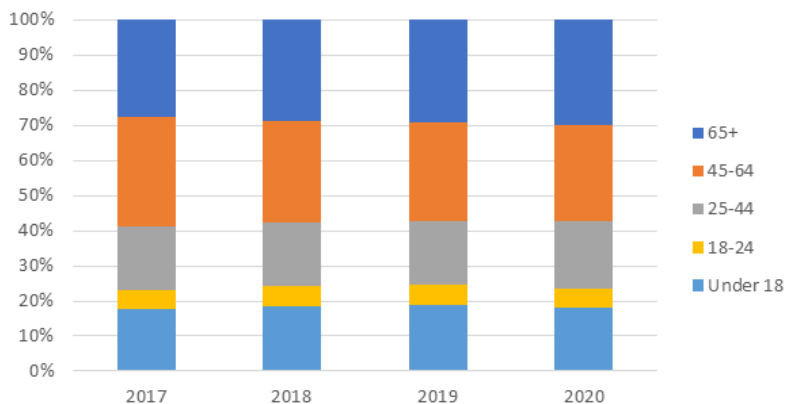


Median Age

Age Distribution



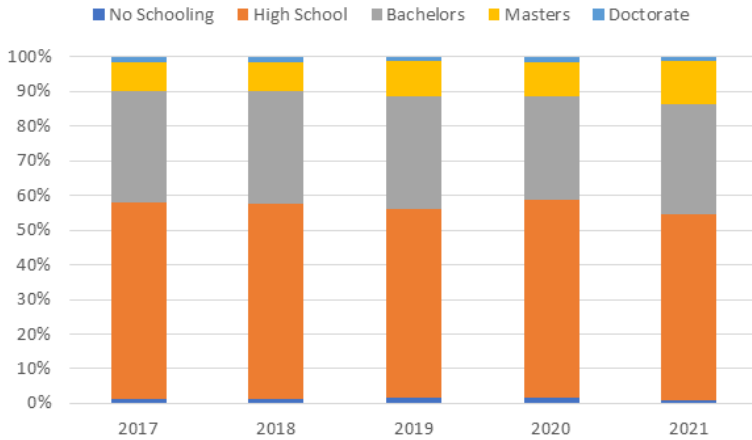
AGE DISTRIBUTION

Lemhi County's age distribution is spread evenly, but slowly getting older. The median age is increasing in the county by 0.8 years in comparison 2017. A young population indicates strong labor supply and future work force growth.

The growth in those over 65 years of age was measured to be 2.5%, since 2017.

EDUCATION

As of 2021, 44.5% of the population over 25 had a college degree.

From 2017 to 2021, the percentage of people with an advanced degree rose from 7.9% to 13.8%.

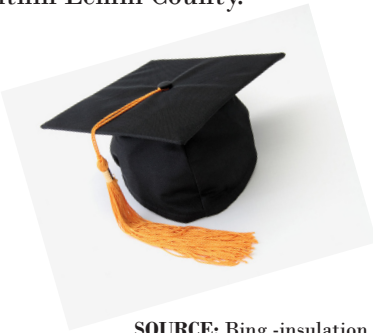

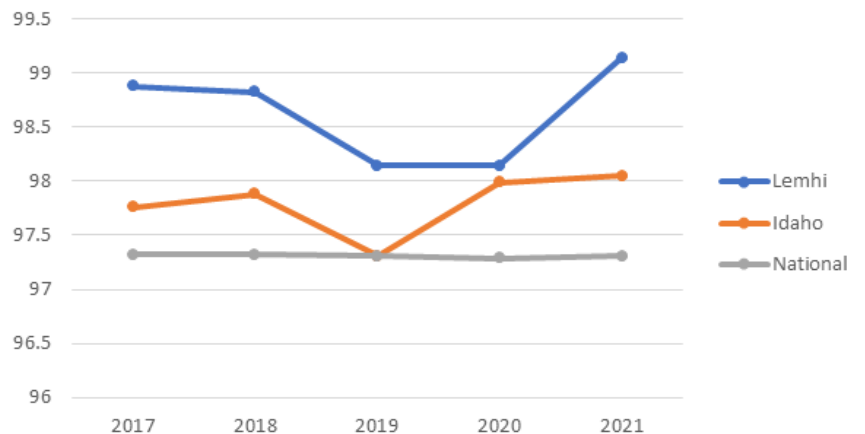
HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION RATES

The high school graduation rates from 2017 to 2021, were calculated by taking the weighted averages of the graduation rates for the school districts within Lemhi County.



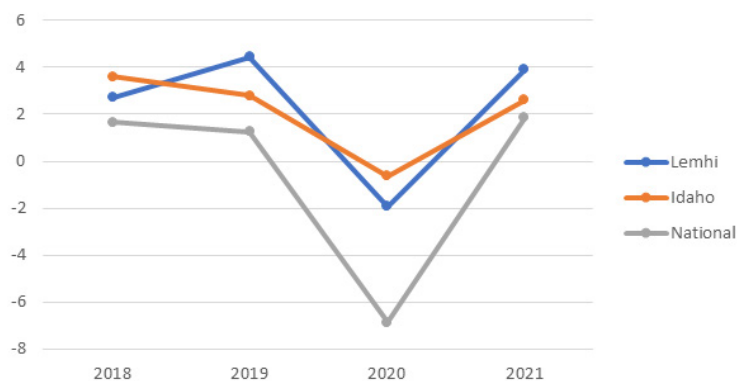

JOB GROWTH

Job numbers have rebounded after a loss of 6.6% positions in 2020. In March 2021, after a 9.1% gain 1,893 positions were filled within the Lemhi County labor market.

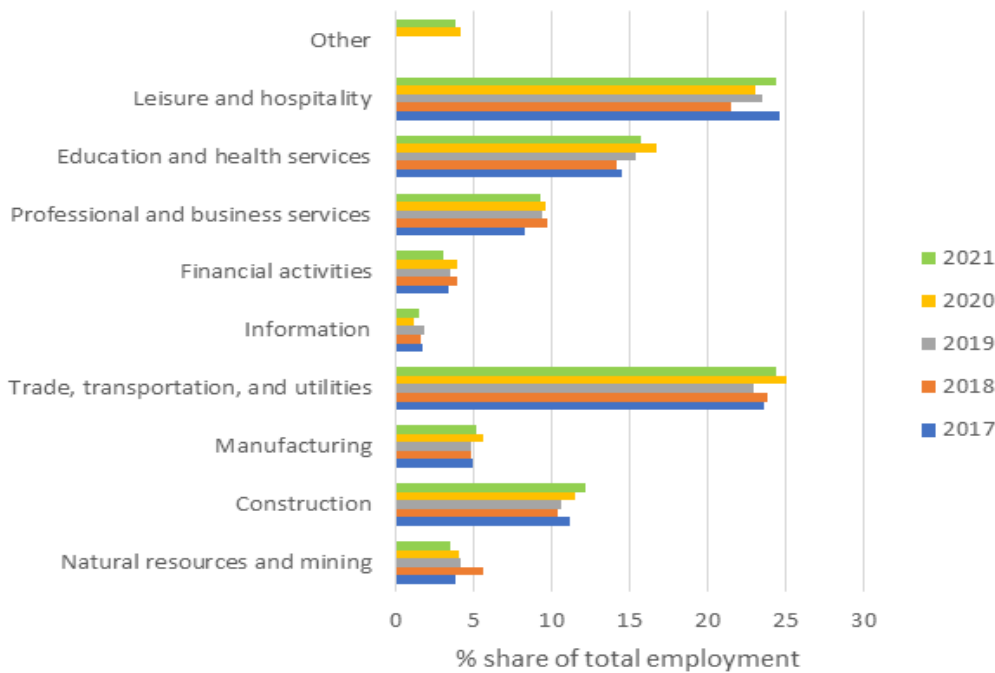

EMPLOYMENT BY SECTOR

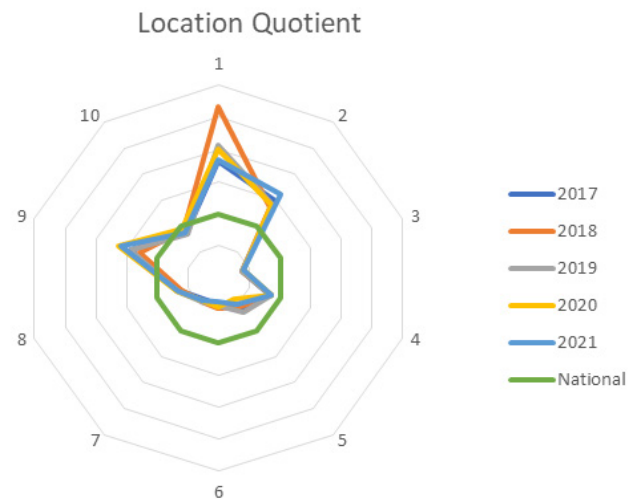
Each sector is represented by its share of the total employment for each given year. The following have been declining in terms of share of total employment: Natural Resources and Mining, Information, and Financial Activities.

The following represents sectors growing Within Lemhi County: Construction, Trade, Transportation, and Utilities, Professional and business services, Education and Health Services, and Leisure and Hospitality. The Leisure and Hospitality Sector industry is the largest in the County employing 448 people or 24.36% of the workforce as of 2021.

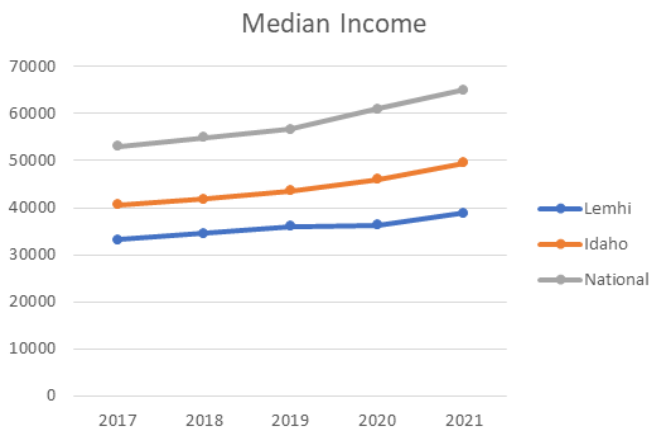
LOCATION QUOTIENT

Location quotient represents the share of a sectors demand for employees in each sector, compared to a national average. For example, Lemhi County's Natural Resources and Mining sector has a location quotient of 1.81 meaning it employs 81% more than the national average. In contrast the Financial Activities sector has a location quotient of 0.36 meaning it employs a third of the national average within this sector.

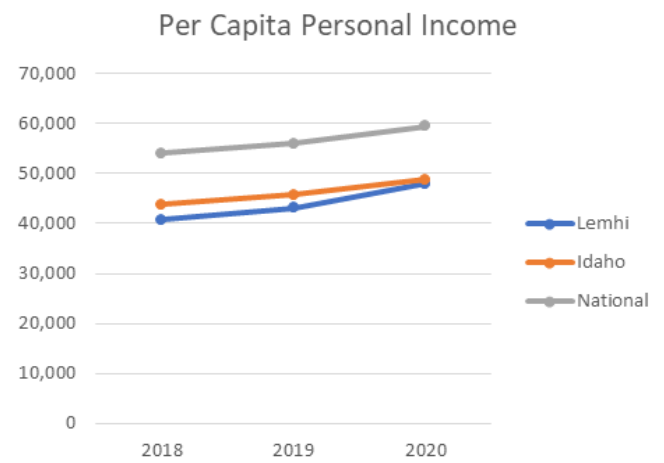

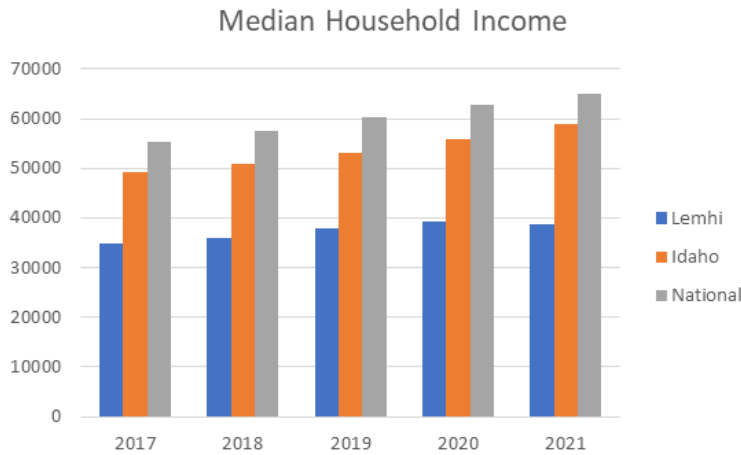

INCOME PER CAPITA

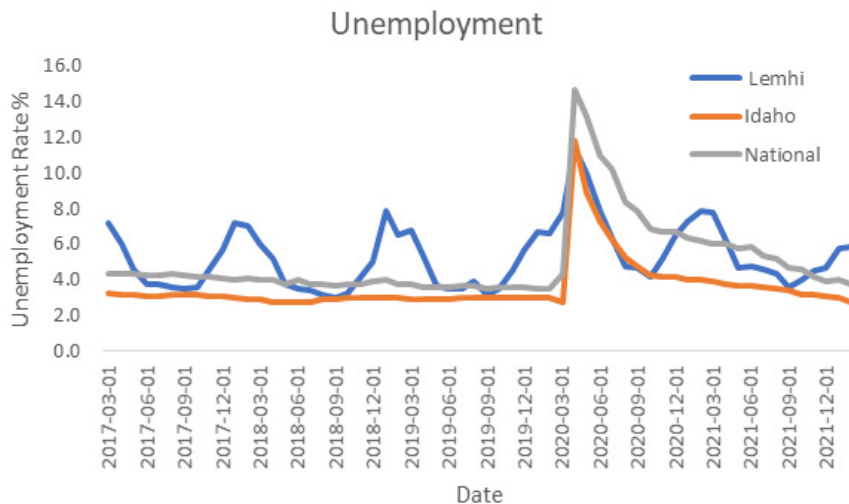
In 2018, the per capita income of Lemhi County was \$40,720. It rose by more than \$7,000 since then and was \$47,981 in 2020.



MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME

Median household income has risen across the nation since 2017. Households in Lemhi County are earning 11.67% more than they did in 2017. Median household income was \$38,819 in 2021.

UNEMPLOYMENT RATE

Unemployment spiked in the nation in early 2020. Lemhi County's unemployment peaked in April 2020, at 11.4% then five months later in September unemployment fell below 5% returning the county to full employment. Unemployment is now 5.9%.

LIVING WAGE

The cost of living was decreasing in Lemhi County in 2021. The cost of living was 89.4 when the average American spends \$100 those in Lemhi County only spent \$89.40. Lemhi County's health care, transportation, and utilities are inexpensive and help keep living costs down.

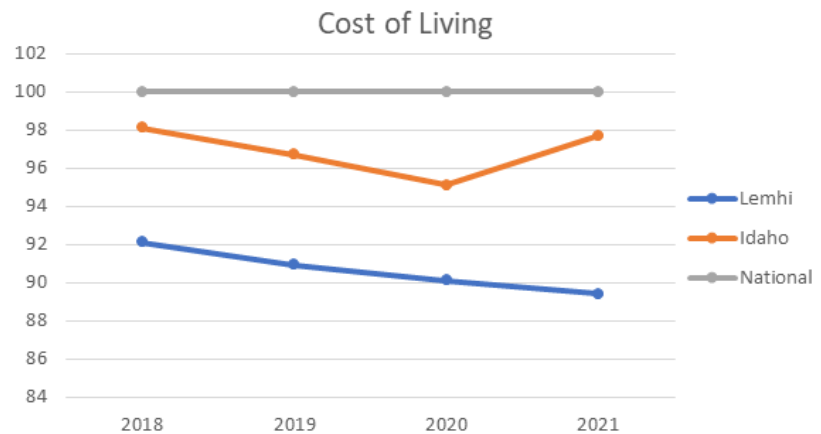
POVERTY

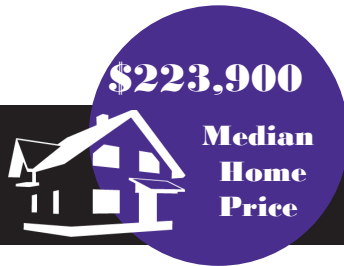

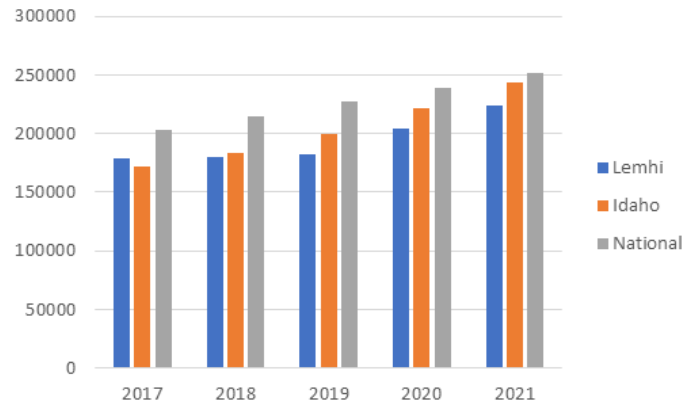
MEDIAN HOME PRICE

GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT

Lemhi County's Gross Domestic Product rose at a rate of 0.9% in 2020. The total GDP of Lemhi County was \$270.5 million in 2020. This accounts for 0.39% of the states GDP and 1.77% of the GDP in Eastern Idaho.
