
NET MIGRATION FLOW

In 2020, more than 200 people moved to Bear Lake County. Since 2017, the average number of new residents was around 120 per year.



AGE DISTRIBUTION


Bear Lake County's age distribution is stable and getting older slowly. The median age is increasing in the county by .1 years in comparison to 2017. A young population indicates a strong labor supply and future work force growth.

The growth in those over 65 years of age was measured to be a .58% increase over the same period.

EDUCATION

As of 2021, 36% of the population over 25 had a college degree.

From 2017 to 2021, the percentage of people with an advanced degree grew from 5.5% to 7.4%.

While the population without a high school diploma or only a high school diploma was 66.1% in 2017, compared to 65.7% in 2021. The percentage is decreasing showing a shift towards higher education in the county.


HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION RATES

The high school graduation rates from 2017 to 2021, were calculated by taking the weighted average of graduation rates for school districts within Bear Lake County.



KEY INDUSTRIES

Bear Lake County's Top 5 industries are: Construction, Manufacturing, Accommodation, Food Services, Administrative, Waste Services, and Retail Trade. Other notable industries not in the Top 5 are: Arts and Entertainment, and Information*.

The rise in the share of those classified under Manufacturing has grown by 66% since 2017. This reflects the county's nine Manufacturers hiring more workers and increasing their share of employment within the market.






LOCATION QUOTIENT


Location quotient represents the share of an industries need for employees in an area compared to its national average. For example, Bear Lake County's Leisure and Hospitality Industry has a location quotient of 1.05 meaning it employs 5% over the national average within the industry. In contrast, the location quotient for the **Education and Health Services** industry has fallen to .34 meaning Bear Lake's share of employment in the industry is a third of the national average.















INCOME PER CAPITA

In 2018, the per capita income of Bear Lake County was \$39,545. It rose by more than \$7,000 dollars since then and was \$46,307 in 2020.

MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME

Median household income has risen across the nation since 2017. Households in Bear Lake County are earning 12.73% more than they did in 2017. Median household income was \$52.829 in 2021.





UNEMPLOYMENT RATE

Unemployment spiked in the nation in early 2020. Bear Lake County's unemployment peaked in April 2020, at 7.8% then two months later in June unemployment fell below 5% returning the county to full employment. Unemployment is now below pre-lockdown levels and is currently 3.5%.

POVERTY

The poverty rate in Bear Lake County has fallen from 15.2% in 2017, to 11.9% in 2021. Poverty was at its lowest in 2020, at 7.9%.


COST OF LIVING

Cost of living is increasing in Bear Lake County; however, it remains under the state and national levels. In 2021, the cost of living was 90 meaning when the average American spends \$100 on normal goods those in Bear Lake County only spent \$90. One of the main drivers for the low cost of living is the abundance of wind and hydroelectric generation helping to bring down utility costs.



MEDIAN HOME VALUE

The median home value in Bear Lake County was lower than the nation with a value of \$243,800 in 2021. There has been a sharp increase in the value of homes across the nation. Since 2017, homes in Bear Lake County have appreciated by 41.33%.

GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT

Bear Lake County's Gross Domestic Product rose at a rate of 0.8% in 2020. The total GDP of Bear Lake County was \$171.1 million in 2020. This accounts for 0.23% of the state's GDP and 1.12% of the GDP within Eastern Idaho.
