

Bonneville County's population increased on an average of 1.38% year-over-year for the last decade. The population growth rate has been positive since 2011 and peaked in 2020 at 4.67%.






NET MIGRATION FLOW

In 2020, more than 5,000 people moved to Bonneville County. Since 2017, the average number of new residents was over 3,000 per year.



AGE DISTRIBUTION

Bonneville County's age distribution is stable and slowly getting older with the median age increasing in the county by .6 years in comparison to 2017. A young population indicates a strong labor supply and future work force growth.


The growth in those over 65 years of age was measured to be a .4% decrease over the same period.

EDUCATION

As of 2021, 57.8% of the population over 25 had a college degree.

From 2017 to 2021, the percentage of people with an advanced degree grew from 14% to 16%.

While the population without a high school diploma or with a high school diploma was 41.9% in 2021, compared to 47.2% in 2017. As the percentage is decreasing this is showing a shift towards higher education in the county.


HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION RATES

Graduation rates from 2017 to 2021, were calculated by taking the weighted average of graduation rates for school districts within Bonneville County.



KEY INDUSTRIES

Bonneville County's Top 5 industries are: Health Care and Social Assistance, Manufacturing, Accommodation, Food Services, Administrative, Waste Services, and Retail Trade. Other notable industries not in the Top 5 are: Construction, Arts and Entertainment, and Information.*

The rise in the share of those classified under Health Care and Social Assistance has grown by 9% since 2017. This reflects more need for healthcare and social assistance employment within the county's market.



Each sector is represented by its share of total employment for each given year. The following sectors have been declining in terms of share of total employment: Accommodation and Food Services, Arts, Entertainment and Recreation, Retail Trade, and Information.


The following represents sectors growing within Bonneville County: Health Care and Social Assistance, Educational Services, Management of Companies and Enterprises, Professional and Technical Services, Finance and Insurance, Manufacturing, and Construction.


The Health Care and Social Assistance sectors are the largest in the county employing 11,110 people or 23.05% of the workforce as of 2021.

LOCATION QUOTIENT

Location quotient represents the share of an industries need for employees in an area compared to its national average. For example, Bonneville County's Education and Health Services Industry has a location quotient of 1.29 meaning it employs 29% over the national average within the industry. In contrast, the location quotient for the Financial Activities Industry has fallen to .73 meaning Bonneville's share of employment in the industry is three quarters of the national average.





Per Capita Personal Income







INCOME PER CAPITA

In 2018, the per capita income of Bonneville County was \$48,007. It rose by more than \$6,000 dollars since then and was \$54,601 in 2020.

MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME

Median household income has risen across the nation since 2017. Households in Bonneville County are earning 16.28% more than they did in 2017. Median household income was \$61,435 in 2021.



UNEMPLOYMENT RATE

Unemployment spiked in the nation in early 2020. Bonneville County's unemployment peaked in April 2020, at 8.4% then two months later in June unemployment fell below 5% returning the county to full employment. Unemployment is now below pre-lockdown levels and is currently 2.9%.

POVERTY

The poverty rate in Bonneville County has fallen from 12.7% in 2017, to 9.8% in 2021. Poverty has been decreasing since 2015, when it peaked at 13.2%.


COST OF LIVING

Cost of living is increasing in Bonneville County, however, it remains under the state and national levels. In 2021, the cost of living was 89.4 meaning when the average American spends \$100 on normal goods while those in Bonneville County only spent \$89.40. One of the main drivers for the low cost of living is the abundance of wind and hydroelectric generation helping to bring down utility costs.



MEDIAN HOME VALUE

The median home value in Bonneville County was lower than both the state and the nation with a value of \$209,200 in 2021. There has been a sharp increase in the value of homes across the nation. Since 2017, homes in Bonneville County have appreciated by 30.58%.

GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT

Bonneville County's Gross Domestic Product fell at a rate of 3.1% in 2020. The total GDP of Bonneville County was \$5.46 billion in 2020. This accounts for 7.41% of the state's GDP and 35.89% of the GDP within Eastern Idaho.
