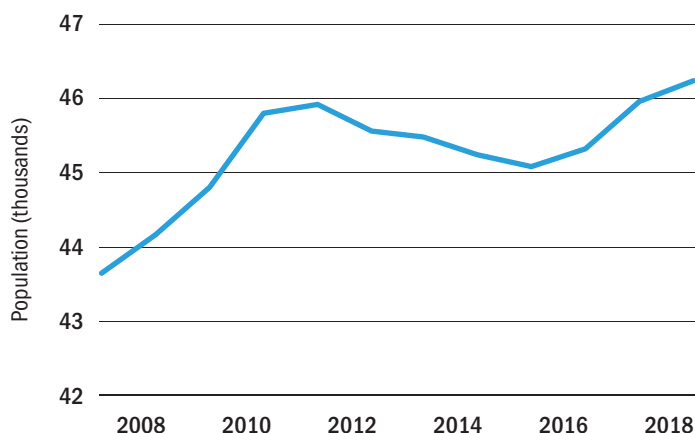


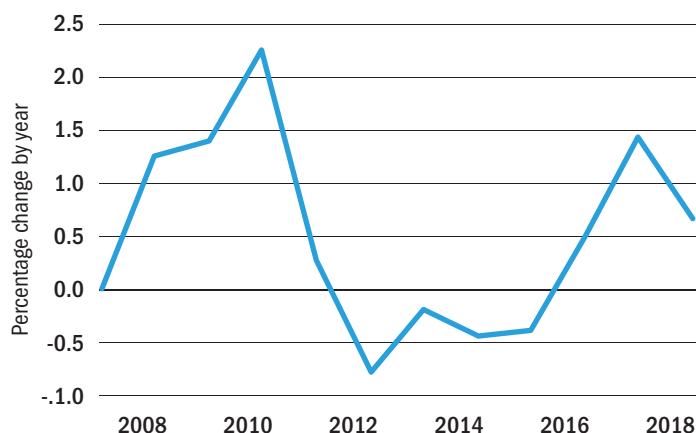

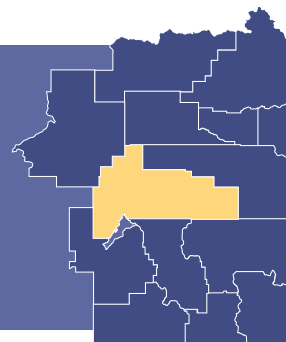
Resident Population



Population Percentage Change

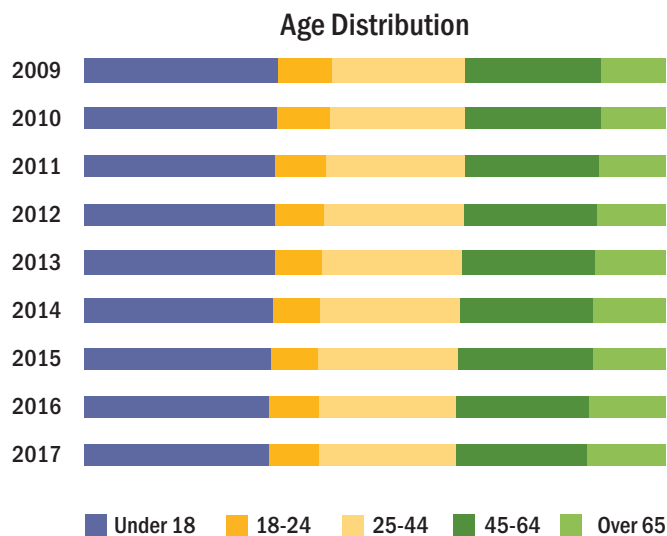


BINGHAM'S POPULATION HAS INCREASED ON AVERAGE BY 0.56% OVER THE LAST DECADE. IT HAS ONLY HAD POSITIVE GROWTH SINCE 2016, REACHING A PEAK OF 46,236 PEOPLE IN 2018.

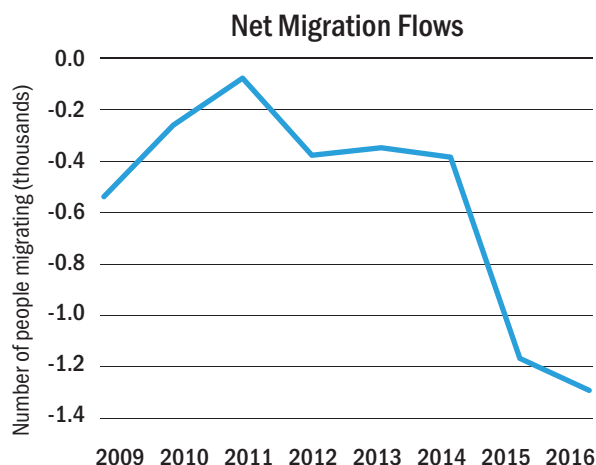

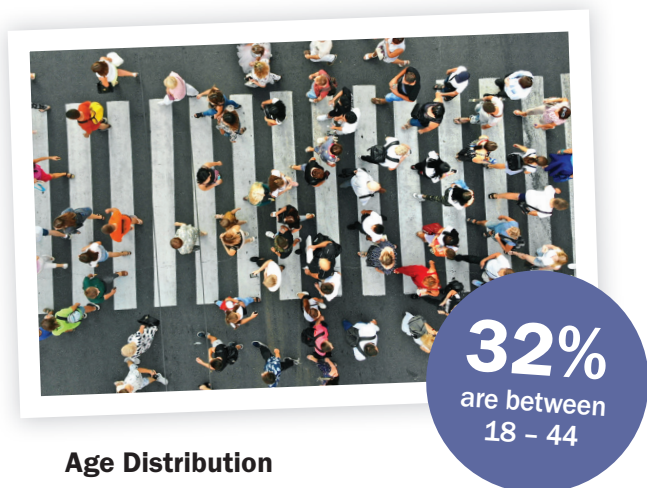

Age Distribution

Bingham County's age distribution has remained fairly constant for all age groups from 2009 to 2017. About one third of the population is between 18 to 44 years of age, indicating a stable workforce.

Net Migration Flows

Bingham County has had more people migrating away from the county than migrating into the county every year since 2009.

Employment

Key Industries

Bingham's top five industries are Healthcare and Social Assistance; Manufacturing; Retail Trade; Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, and Hunting; and Educational Services. These industries employ the largest percentage of the workforce in the county. However, some industries that have experienced a positive growth in the workforce that are not included in the top five are Finance and Insurance, as well as Administrative and support and waste management services.

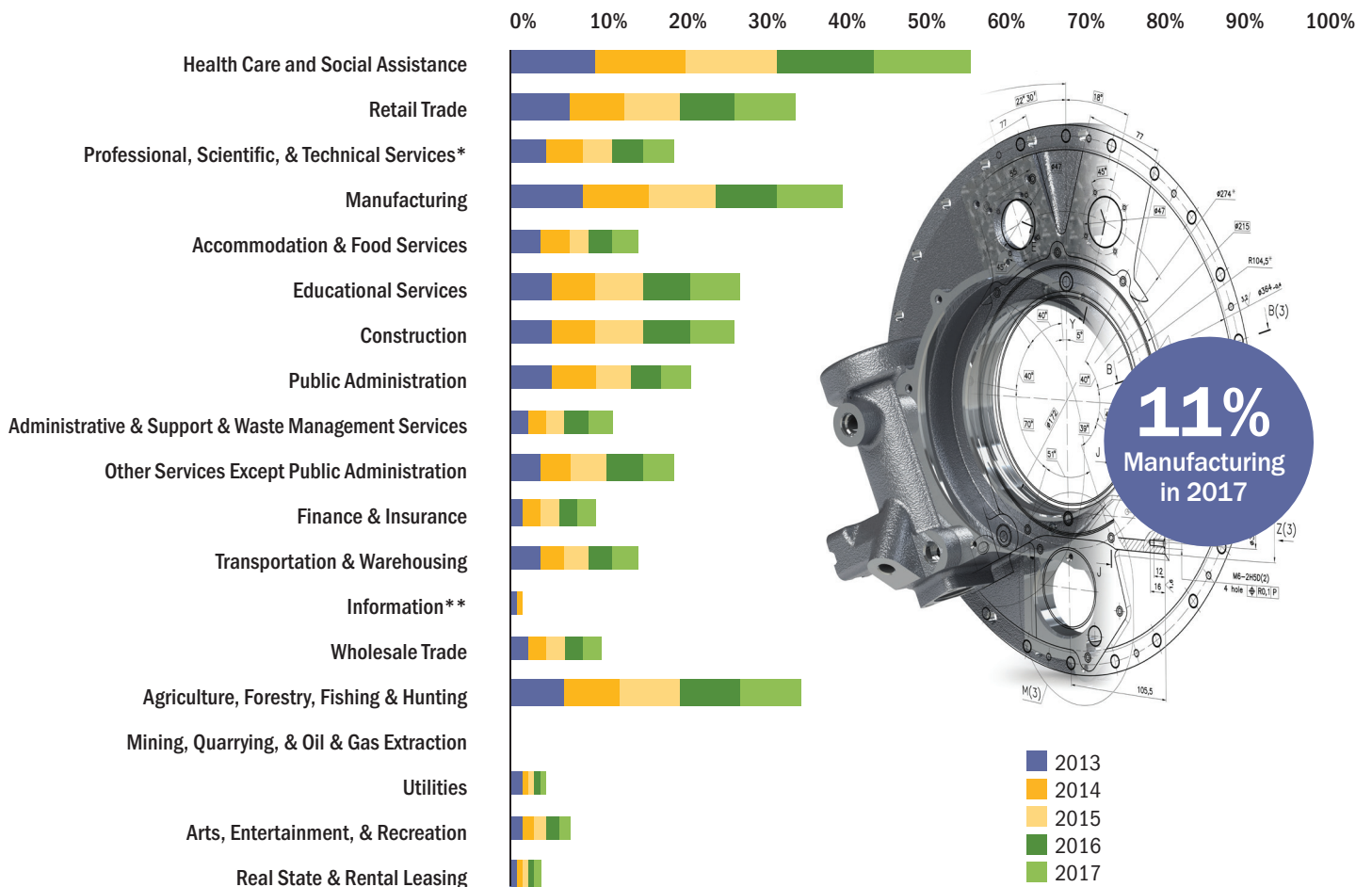
From 2013 to 2017, the number of people working in the Finance and Insurance, as well as Administrative and support and waste management services industries have increased by 53% and 36%, respectively.

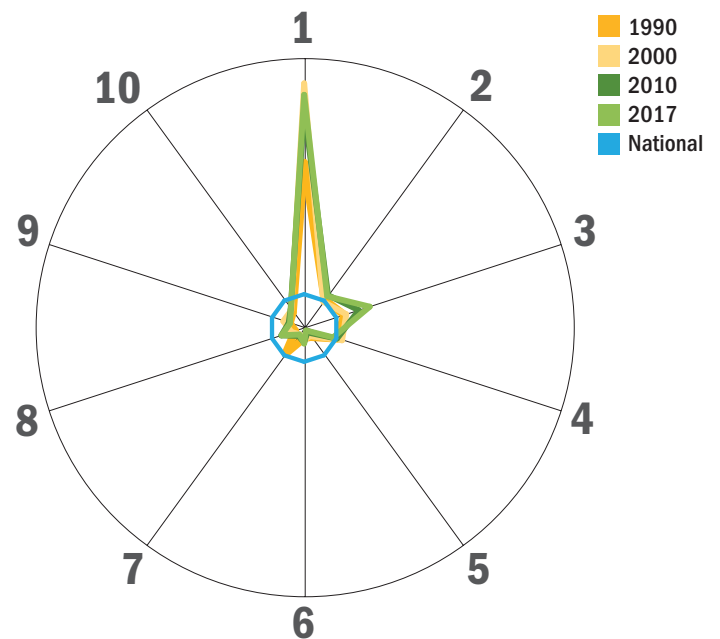

Location Quotients

A location quotient shows the industry's share of an area's employment relative to the national average. For example, a location quotient of 2.0 indicates that an industry accounts for twice the share of employment in the area than it does nationally, and a location quotient of 0.5 indicates the area's share of employment in the industry is half the national share.

Education

As of 2017, 28.4% of the population over 25 years of age had some sort of college degree.

From 2009 to 2017, the percentage of people over 25 years of age having a bachelor's degree increased from 12% to 13.8%, respectively. Other education levels did not see such high increase in percentage points in the last years.

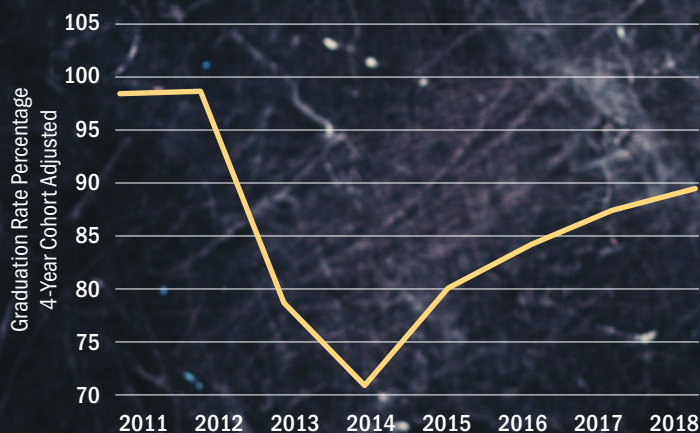
While the population over 25 years of age with only a high school diploma or less is decreasing, more people are working towards some sort of college degree, showing a shift towards higher education.

HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION RATES

The high school graduation rates from 2014 to 2018 were calculated by doing a weighted average of the graduation rates for the school districts in Bingham County.

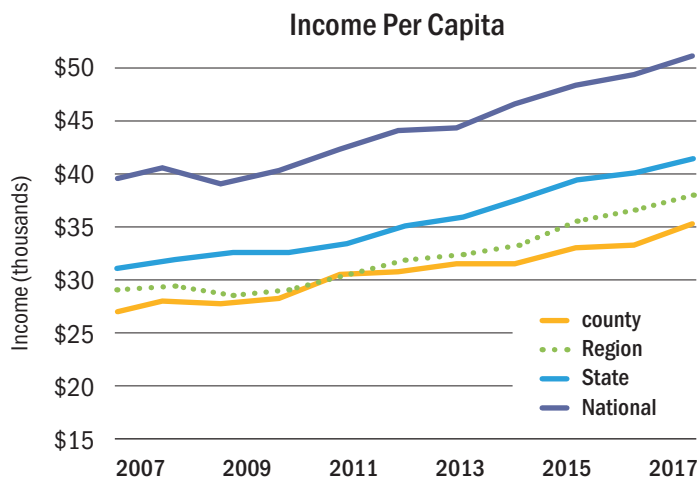
Graduation rates increased from 80.7% to 89.6% from 2014 to 2017.

Income Per Capita

From 2007 to 2017, income per capita in Bingham County has grown by 22% at an average rate of 2.8% per year.

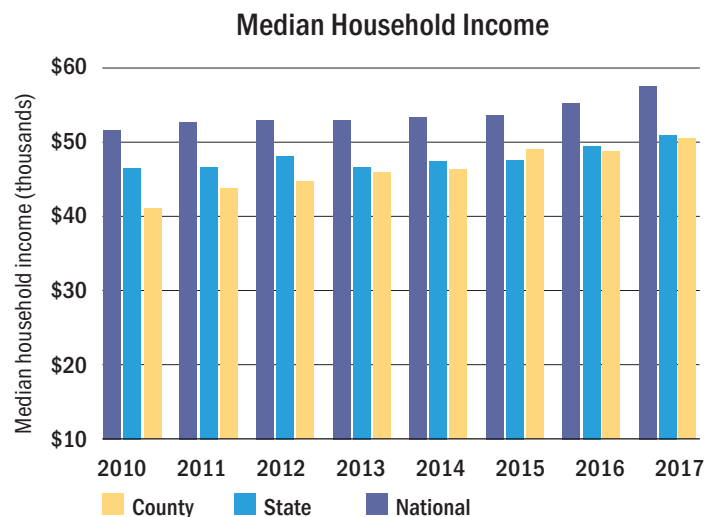
Median Household Income

As of 2017, half of the population earned an annual income above \$51,307 and the other half earned an annual income below \$51,307. This number has grown by 16.3% since 2010. Bingham County's median household income is growing at an average rate of 2.2% per year. It has been higher than the state since 2013, but lower than the nation.

Poverty Level

The poverty level in Bingham County has been decreasing from 2012 to 2017 from 15.4% to



13.1%, respectively. The weighted average for people living under the poverty level from 2012 to 2017 is 14.1%.

Unemployment Rate

The unemployment rate for Bingham County is lower than the unemployment rate for the nation and the state, but it is higher than the one for the region. The recession in 2008-2009 explains the peak in 2009-2010. The 2018 unemployment rate for Bingham County was 2.7%.

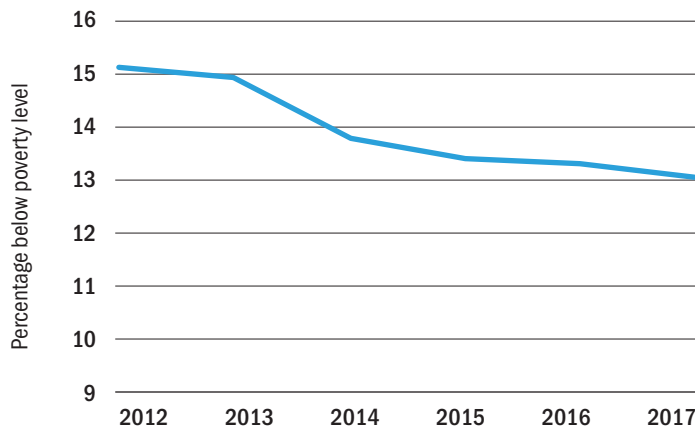
As of July 2018, Bingham County had 14,903 households with an average of 3.3 individuals per household.

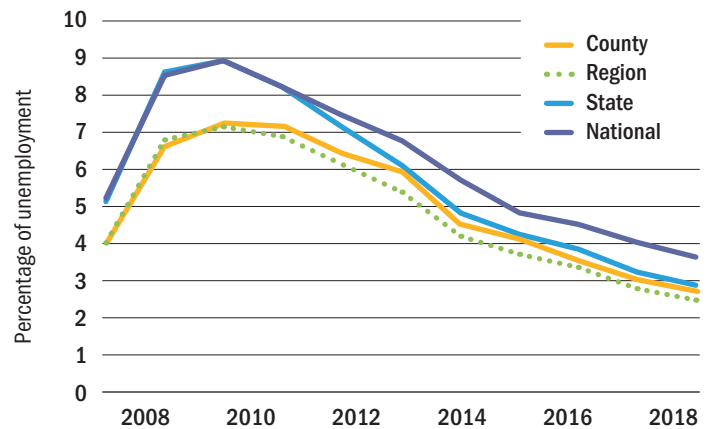

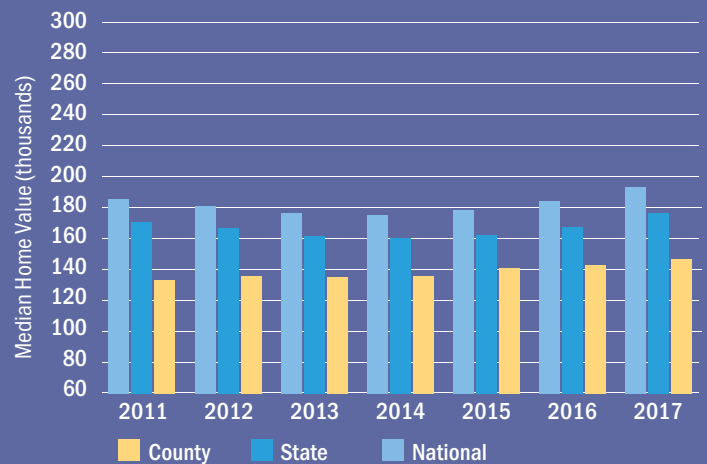

Gross Domestic Product

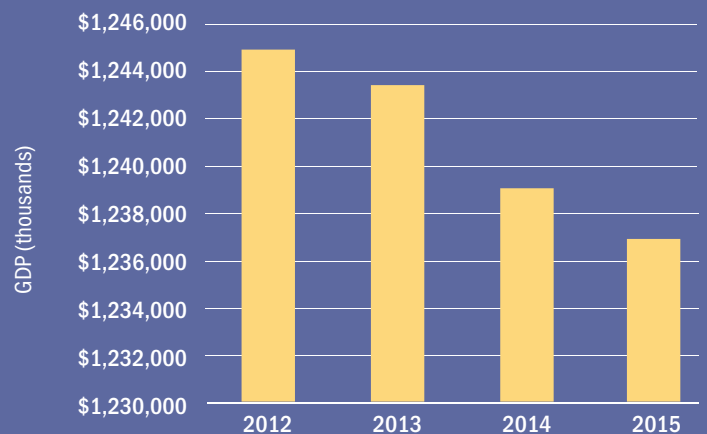
